The certified art teacher is the chief instructor at his new venture, *Wiseman Studio of Art & Gallery*. Everyone is welcome to the official opening of *Wiseman Studio of Art & Gallery* on Friday, Feb. 2, 6pm-9pm in Coquitlam (210-1046 Austin Ave). Wesely began offering classes last October.

The studio is a school accommodating up to 60 students each week in the study of the visual arts; watercolour, acrylic, oil, pen & ink, and sketching. Each class is two hours per week for five weeks (with home work).
